Meaning: To throb means to pulsate or beat rhythmically, often in a way that is strong and noticeable, as in a sound or pain.

1. The bass from the speakers made the floor throb with every beat.
2. After the long run, her legs began to throb painfully.
3. He could feel his heart throb in his chest as he prepared for the big moment.
