

THYRSUS

Meaning: Thyrsus: a staff or wand, typically topped with a pine cone and entwined with ivy and vines, symbolizing fertility and associated with the worship of Dionysus in ancient Greek culture.

1. The ancient Greeks often depicted the thyrsus in their art as a symbol of fertility and revelry.
2. During the Dionysian festivals, participants would carry a thyrsus, adorned with ivy and vines.
3. In classical literature, the thyrsus represents both the joy of life and the chaotic nature of wine.
