

TIDE-RODE

Meaning: TIDE-RODE refers to the condition of a boat being secured or anchored in a way that allows it to rise and fall with the tide.

1. The boat's hull was designed to withstand the challenges of being tide-rode during storms.
2. As the tide rose, the fishermen secured their nets to ensure they could easily tide-rode until morning.
3. We watched the graceful movements of the dolphins as they tide-rode alongside our vessel.
4. While anchored, the yacht occasionally tide-rode, gently rocking with the ebb and flow of the water.
