Meaning: Utraquist (noun): a member of a religious movement advocating for the laity to receive communion in both bread and wine.

1. The utraquist movement sought to allow the laity to receive communion in both kinds, bread and wine.
2. Her beliefs were rooted in utraquism, emphasizing the importance of full participation in the Eucharist.
3. During the religious debate, the utraquist position was defended passionately by several theologians.
4. The utraquist followers argued that denying the cup to the laity was contrary to the teachings of Christ.
5. Historical records show that utraquism played a significant role in the religious reforms of the 15th century.
