

VIATICUM

Meaning: Viaticum refers to the Eucharist given to a dying person as a means of spiritual comfort, or a provision of money or supplies for a journey.

1. The priest administered the viaticum to the dying man, offering him comfort in his final moments.
2. In medieval times, travelers often carried a small amount of money as viaticum for their journeys.
3. The concept of viaticum extends beyond the religious context, symbolizing any support given to someone facing a significant transition.
4. As she prepared for surgery, her family gathered to provide her with emotional viaticum, reassuring her of their love and support.
5. The church viewed the sacrament of viaticum as a vital preparation for the soul's journey after death.
