Meaning: VICARIAL: relating to or denoting a role or function performed on behalf of another, especially in a religious or legal context.

1. The vicarial role of the priest was essential in maintaining the spiritual well-being of the community.
2. In a vicarial relationship, one party can act on behalf of another, often seen in legal contexts.
3. The vicarial authority granted to the bishop allowed him to make decisions on behalf of the diocese.
4. She felt a vicarial responsibility for her younger siblings after their parents had to travel for work.
5. His vicarial duty as a mentor was to guide the young athletes through both their training and personal challenges.
