Meaning: To waylay means to intercept or ambush someone unexpectedly, often with the intention of confronting or detaining them.

1. The detectives set a trap to waylay the suspect as he exited the building.
2. Hikers should be cautious, as rumors persist of wolves that waylay travelers in the woods.
3. The thief planned to waylay the unsuspecting victim near the dark alley.
4. In a moment of desperation, he decided to waylay the car that had just passed.
5. The bandits would often waylay merchants on the road to the market, stealing their goods.
